Clarence Michael James Dennis was born on 7 September 1876 to James and Catherine Dennis of the Auburn Hotel. A few months later the family moved to the Watervale Hotel, and later to the Gladstone Hotel. From 1892-1908 James Dennis held the licence of the Beetaloo Reservoir Hotel at Laura. As a young man CJ Dennis was active and well known in the town, working for local solicitor WJ Stockadle. He left Laura for pursuits in Broken Hill and Adelaide, returning occasionally including for the celebration of his 21st birthday.	FOLK

Laura Information Centre News:


Along with the rest of Laura, the Information Centre is busy stocking up for the Folk Fair.


CJ Dennis is also an important part of our display, with copies of his work, particularly his popular children's books, being of interest to many visitors.

Crystal Brook Regional Community Bank®

Project Update:

The Crystal Brook Regional Community Bank steering committee has just received confirmation from Bendigo Bank that they will support the opening of an agency in Crystal Brook. This news has come just at the right time, following the closure of the Crystal Brook

branch of Bank SA.

The opening of an agency will enable clients from Crystal Brook and the neighbouring towns to carry out their day to day banking in the town. The steering committee are currently working on finding a suitable location for the agency and are hoping it will be up and running within a couple of months.

We are currently sitting at almost \$10 million worth of banking on the books (loans, investments, savings accounts etc.) with \$12 million being the target to enable us to move to the next stage, being the feasibility study. We then need to meet the target of \$18 million of banking business to open a branch.

The steering committee believe the presence of an agency in the town will encourage people to move their banking over to Bendigo Bank which will help us to reach our target for a fully operational Crystal Brook Regional Community Bank in the foreseeable future.

Karl Goode, the Gawler branch manager, has been visiting Crystal Brook for some months now, to meet with our community to discuss their banking needs and providing very competitive banking options. Karl has been very supportive of our campaign and will continue to travel up from Gawler for appointments.

These appointments are conducted in Crystal Brook on designated banking days.

Laura Hospital Repairs Update:

Repairs to the water damaged section of the Laura Hospital have been completed. Full services at the Health Unit have resumed. The hospital staff are to be commended on their extra efforts over the last few months.





The above photos of the nurse's station and the Accident and Emergency section are indicative of work completed.

Crystal Brook Hospital Guild:

The Crystal Brook Hospital Guild has been fund raising for many years to provide improved equipment for the benefit of staff and patients.

However the Guild is now struggling to have enough people to continue these fundraising activities. Hospital Guild meets on the first Wednesday of February, April, June, August, October and December at 2pm in the Hospital Meeting Room.

Enrolled Nurse (EN) Cadets:

We currently have two EN cadets at the Laura Hospital and one at Crystal Brook Hospital. The EN Cadetship is a partnership between the Hospital and TAFE SA where students complete modules and attend on-campus workshops in Port Pirie as well as work at the hospital two days per week.

Country Health SA allocates funding to make these positions available to selected hospitals to help grow-our-own nursing staff and provides a pathway to becoming a registered nurse.

We also have a Year 11 Gladstone High School student working at Laura Hospital as an Aged Care Trainee one day per week until the end of 2017. This is a partnership between the hospital, Gladstone High School, Trade Schools for the Future, TAFE SA and Apprenticeship Support Australia.

During this time the trainee will also be completing TAFE SA modules as well as Year 11 and 12.



Laura Community Caravan Park News:

The north-west corner of the caravan park has been closed off to vehicular traffic, the entrance is now off Victoria Street, and exit via North Terrace.



Graham Pech and his band of merry men, Barry Harvey, Geoff Lange and Ray Cummings, have put a lot of grunt into working on farm gates which were sourced from Hinks property opposite the Laura Golf Club and donated by Ashley and Janet Harvie of Wirrabara, plus the heavy red gum posts (see picture below).

It must be stressed that this roadway is **not** a public thoroughfare for locals to use a short cut. It is especially dangerous when the offenders are disobeying the 5km speed limit.

Look out for the new entrance sign which will be erected prior to Folk Fair.

Although business has been relatively slow over summer, bookings are coming in thick and fast now. The park is fully booked for the Folk Fair, bookings are strong for the Easter period, and the Wanderers Caravan Club will be returning mid-April.

Work on the paving along the western side of Herbert Street toward Stevens Motors is on

track to be completed by the Folk Fair weekend.





Preliminary work has also begun on the Laura Stormwater Mitigation Scheme with various infrastructure items arriving in Laura as well as drainage trenching begun west toward the Rocky river.

Rocky River Lions:

Lions Club members will again be selling their popular donuts at the Laura Folk Fair, as they

have been since the early days of the Fair.

This year, Lions have sponsored the Fair to the tune of \$1500 in recognition of the important role this event plays in promoting Laura and the Southern Flinders region. May it continue to grow from strength to strength.

The Lions donut van will be in attendance at Laura and Gladstone home games for netball and football this season.

A total of \$7800 was raised from the sale of sample grain at the Gladstone Silo Complex this harvest. Most of this funding will be targeted towards community projects for the benefit of residents within the Rocky River district.

Examples from previous harvest's include, \$4,000 towards the cost of the new BBQ's in the Laura parklands and \$1,000 for the new external blinds for aged care residents at the Hospital.

Recent donations have also been made to the Laura Community Gym, \$750 and the Lions Pinery Fire Appeal, \$500.
