Remembering:

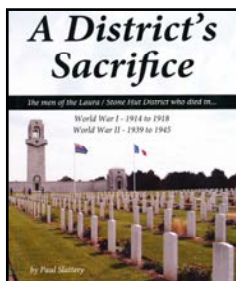
France is normally associated with pleasant feelings based around superb architecture, fine food and wine... and perhaps romance. However recently it has been foremost in the media in relation to violence; the deaths of 84 innocent people in the Bastille Day tragedy, and the centenary commemorations of the Battle of Fromelles.

Fromelles is a small village in French Flanders, where a battle on 19 July 1916 has been described as the worst day in Australian history. Within twenty-four hours 1,917 Australian men died. Among these were men from Peterborough, Gladstone, Crystal Brook and Port Pirie.

Meanwhile the Battle of the Somme was raging further to the south, and on 23 July Australia became involved at Pozieres. During the following six weeks 6,800 Australians were killed in the fighting at Pozieres and nearby Mouquet Farm. These included four men with a Laura connection, Roy Dunn, Wilfred Clarke, Theo Richardson and John Groves. Many others from the surrounding region were also killed, including the three Potter brothers from Yongala, who were all killed on the same day.

Few families were left untouched by Australia's involvement with the so called 'war to end all wars'. From a population of less than five million, almost 417,000 enlisted, of whom 60,000 were killed. Further to that many of the wounded returned home, broken in either body or spirit to die at an early age.

The horrors of the wars are not to be glorified, but are to be remembered with respect, which comes from knowledge. - sculpture of the Beetaloo Hotel on the original site
- Stockdale's solicitor's office where CJ worked as a clerk
- *Laura Standard* printing office, now CocoLaura, chocolate shop
- grave of his brother Bert in Laura cemetery
- inspirational spots such as the Rocky River and *Possum Park*
- ... or take a drive out to the Beetaloo Reservoir

Both Gladstone and Laura are participants in '***Brush with Art***' an annual spring time art trail of fifteen art galleries and exhibitions throughout the Flinders Ranges.

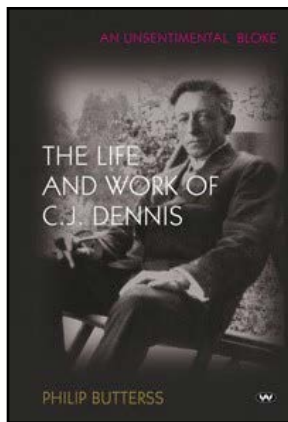

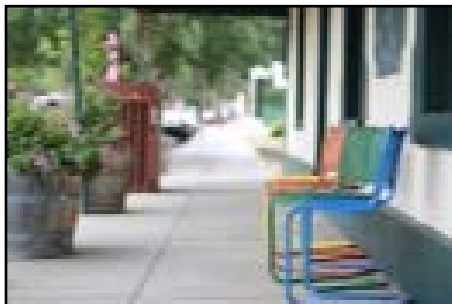

Laura Flood Mitigation Project:

As the warmer months approach, Council is readying itself for the next stage of the Laura Flood Mitigation Project. The project is anticipated to be completed across the next two financial years, with Council recently approving funding for this year's portion of the work as part of its 2016/17 budget. Pending weather conditions, work is anticipated to recommence in the short term.

Welcome to Peter Porch:

Following the recent retirement of Peter Broughill as Council's Manager of Engineering Services, Council has welcomed Peter Porch to the team as the its Manager of Operational Services. Peter's role now includes the overseeing of both the former Engineering and Environmental Services Departments. Peter arrives at Northern Areas, having previously served as Works Manager at the Burnie City Council in Tasmania, whilst he has also served at the Devonport City Council.

Community Grant Funding:

At the recent opening of the Hornsdale Wind Farm, funding recipients were announced as part of the 2015/16 Hornsdale Wind Farm Community Fund. Amongst the recipients were the Laura Memorial Civic Centre, who received \$2,500 toward an upgrade of the air conditioning system, whilst the Stone Hut Soldier Memorial Hall Committee received \$2,500 for the upgrade of the floor at the Hall, including the sanding back of the floor boards.

Golden North to upgrade production line:

Golden North has been awarded a \$200,000 grant from the state government's Upper Spencer Gulf and Outback Futures Program to upgrade its icecream production line at Laura, with an anticipated doubling of impulse production output.

The \$595,000 project will provide a dedicated production line for items, including Golden North Giant Twins, Swings and Vanilla Cups which are deemed to be impulse purchase products.

The line will also allow the South Australian-owned and operated manufacturing business to introduce new products to its range.

The new equipment will improve the company's production through greater processing capacity, and its new freezing and packaging equipment.

Golden North general manager Peter Adamo said increased production and the development of new products would play an important role in the company's expansion into interstate and export markets.

"This upgrade continues to build the capacity of our manufacturing facility, which will result in more than doubling our current impulse production capacity," he said.

The \$2 million Upper Spencer Gulf and Outback Futures Program is a one-off grants program which was opened in November 2015 in recognition of the challenges brought about by the downturn of the resources sector and the impending closure of the Port Augusta power station and Leigh Creek coal mine.

Grants from the program have been made available to eligible small projects from \$50,000 up to \$200,000.

The program supports the delivery of projects that will contribute to economic diversification, resilience and capacity building of Upper Spencer Gulf and Outback communities, creating sustainable economic benefits to the region and the State.

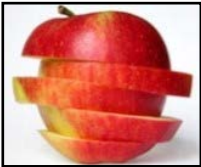

Just in time for the re-opening of the Stone Hut Bakery in May, the Stone Hut Development Committee were able to replace the 17 badly weathered signs dotted around the township.

With the assistance of a Community Grant from Northern Areas Council, the original 2008 signs were reproduced by Pirie Signs and Designs, this time using a UV coating that should last 7 to 10 years.

Each sign bears an original historical photo and an appropriate brief description of the early days of Stone Hut.

These signs have attracted visitors since they were first installed in 2008.

Healthy Winter Soup

Soups served with grains and crusty breads come together to make well balanced dinners. Freeze left overs for quick and easy lunches during the week.

Ingredients

1 tablespoon (20ml) olive oil; 1 clove garlic-crushed; 1 onion -finely diced, 4 stalks of celery-chopped; 3 carrots-chopped; 1 litre of reduced salt liquid Stock Sprinkle with chopped parsley to serve.

Method

Step 1: Heat oil in a large saucepan and add onion and garlic. Cook until onion has softened.

Step 2: Add remaining vegetables and stock. Stir through and continue heating.

Step 3: When the soup reaches a boil turn down the heat and allow to simmer for 10-15 minutes or until vegetables have softened.

**Use this soup recipe as the foundation for more soups to suit your own taste. You can create a range of different soups to suit your own liking by simply varying the vegetables, meat and herbs and spices.



Chicken noodle soup

Slice 300g chicken breast and add alongside 50g uncooked spaghetti to the foundation soup recipe and cook through.

Pumpkin and lentil soup

To foundation recipe add one cup washed dried lentils and 450g peeled and diced pumpkin. Blend and serve. Add 2 tablespoons of mild curry paste if you want a little more spice.

Lamb and barley soup

To the foundation recipe add 3 lean lamb shanks and ¾ cup pearl barley. Cook until meat is tender, remove meat from bones and return to soup.
