There's a lot to see! Paintings of Australia's early days with horses are a speciality.


The studio is open 7 days, where James McMaster is available for guided tours if Joan is not available.

1876 - 2016 140 years of local government in Laura since 1876:

When the Hundred of Booyoolie was first opened up for closer settlement in 1871, its roads were under the control of a District Road Board. Following the establishment of the township of Laura in 1872, the *Government Gazette* of 2 March 1876 proclaimed the whole of the Hundred of Booyoolie a District Council area, the **District Council of Booyoolie**.

When the Hughes family first took up land in 1845 they adopted the name Booyoolee from the indigenous people. The spelling Booyoolie surfaced in July 1871 when the **Hundred of Booyoolie** was proclaimed and then the township of Booyoolie in 1875 (subsequently Gladstone). This is just one of many variations of spelling which have occurred in bureaucratic administration throughout history.

The first meeting of the **District Council of Booyoolie** was held at the Laura Hotel (now Laura Soap Shoppe) on 13 March 1876 with John Cook being appointed Chairman. The area included the townships of Stone Hut, Laura, Gladstone and Booyoolie. From this area, the District Council of Gladstone was later severed and in 1882 the **Corporation of the Township of Laura** was formed

In 1931 the Local Government Boundaries Commission, which had been taking evidence across the state for many years, declared that the District Councils of Booyoolie, Gladstone and portion of the Caltowie Council, and the Town Corporations of Laura, and Gladstone should be merged to form a new District Council of Booyoolie.

This great thinking from the bureaucrats naturally met with strong opposition but resulted in the formation in 1932 of the new **District Council of Laura**, and District Council of Gladstone, incorporating their previous town corporations.

History was more or less to be repeated with the formation in 1988 of the **Rocky River Council** which embraced the Laura and Gladstone area (as predicted in 1931!) and also the District Council of Georgetown.



Our local government area was further broadened in 1997 with the creation of **Northern Areas Council**, which also embraced the Jamestown and Spalding areas.

Although Laura has been well served by local government through 140 years, the Laura Community Development and Tourism Association now plays a pivotal role in matters affecting our community.

Conservation of illuminated address to 'The Ladies and Residents of Laura' after World War 1:

This illuminated address recognizes the support of the people of the Laura district towards the war effort. Being prefaced as presented to the **Ladies**... is of special recognition of the sacrifices of those women whose lives were changed dramatically through the absence or loss of their menfolk.

As well as supporting the war effort through knitting, sending parcels etc., their personal lives, working lives and responsibilities changed dramatically both during and after the war.

A grant from the Historical Society of South Australia has recently provided funds enabling RRHAS to have professional conservation work done on this illuminated address which has suffered water, dust and silverfish damage during almost a hundred years.

RRHAS President, Greg Slattery displayed the restored illuminated address at the November meeting of the HSSA, just days after conservation work had been completed.

With Christmas on the horizon it's time to consider some gifts with a local connection. There is a wonderful array of local products and souvenirs available at the Laura Information Centre that support the work of the RRHAS

- Rehearse your Bushfire Action Plan with your family.
- Prepare evacuation kit.
- Ensure you have a battery-powered radio to hear warnings
- Monitor fire restrictions.
