

We often voice disapproval about what we read in the media, whether it be sensationalism or misrepresentation. The *Laura Standard* newspaper which served the district very well from 1889 until the 1940s is a treasure trove of information about early Laura. Prior to the *Laura Standard*, local news was regularly reported in *The Northern Argus* (established 1869) from Clare.

The Laura Standard may be accessed on microfilm at the Laura Archives and the State Library of SA. The microfilming was funded by our Rocky River Historic & Art Society in the early 1980s and was assisted at the time by a loan from the District Council of Laura. Costing about half the price of a new motor car it was a major project. Both newspapers are now available on the internet on Trove, thanks to a joint digitization project between the National Library of Australia and the State Library. These early papers contain jewels of information and an interesting use of language.

Less than a year after blocks of land for the township of Laura were first auctioned (August 1872) an article in the *Northern Argus* in June 1873 stated, "Little to relieve the monotony of the town has of late taken place."

The fact that Burton's Circus had visited the fledgling township, and that the construction of the mill and a Wesleyan Church were imminent was hardly monotonous. The Laura Hotel had already been licensed. Three months later in September 1873 The Northern Argus reported that "the Catholic church will be commenced on Monday and that a committee had been formed to establish an Institute... and that two other stores are to be built, one to include a chemist shop".

These activities hardly equate to monotony, nor could such swift development take place in this current environment of prolonged bureaucratic processes.

Laura, May 27.

Little to relieve the monotony of the township has of late taken place. Perhaps the great event of the month has been the visit of Mr. Burton's circus, and judging from the reception his company met with, I should think he had no reason to regret giving Laura a call.

The late rains, though light, have come

most timely.

I observe that the wheat on the stiff clay lands looks very thin, and some farmers have already resown. This, I trust, will only have to be resorted to by a few.

only have to be resorted to by a few.

The erection of a flour mill at Laura by
Messrs. Walters & Sons will greatly add to
the importance and prosperity of our township. As yet I have not learned of the tenders

being accepted.

It is also intended to erect a Wesleyan Church here, so that before the close of 1873 we may reasonably hope that the two most important buildings any town can boast of will be added to the many now being erected in Laura.



PROBUS NEWS

The October Meeting was held at the Laura Sporting Reserve followed by lunch at the Stone Hut Bakery. Our Guest Speaker was Greg Wheeler who had been a GP for 40 years and now retired in Gladstone. Greg's early years were in Jamestown where his father was the Chemist.

He studied in Adelaide and did Post Grad. work there before moving to Loxton as a GP. In later years he worked at the Aboriginal Medical Service at Alice Springs and the APY Lands – Papunya, Blackstone, Jamieson, Mimili, Pipalyajara, Indulkana, Lake Nash, Uluru then Davenport in Port Augusta. Slides of his wanderings made it all very interesting..

Then on the 29th Hanley's took us to Port Adelaide. We were there by 11am to go on a 2 hour luncheon cruise down the Port River and past a fairly industrial area including Torrens Island, Adelaide Submarine, the quarantine station to the Outer Harbour Container Berth – and we did see Dolphins near the mangroves of Torrens Island. 
