Laura CFS News



The Laura CFS is gearing up for our next fire danger season, which started on the 15th November, and is planned to finish on 30th April 2021. Our members have completed their 'Burnover Drills, which involve simulating fire trapping fire-fighters in a CFS appliance for a period of time, and the steps required to protect themselves in the cab, and breath through oxygen masks.

As many people would now be aware, Laura not only has a traditional fire truck (ours being Laura 34, meaning 3000L of water on board, and 4 wheel drive, hence the 34 designation), but in 2019 we also house a QRV (Quick Response Vehicle), being a 4WD ute, with a 400L water tank on the back. This smaller vehicle allows access into areas that a truck may be too large for, and get to fires quicker.



We are very lucky that our local farmers are an integral part of local fire fighting efforts, and are always there to help when there is an incident in the local area. A lot of work has been put into building relationships and coordination between farmers and the CFS, with our Laura CFS Member Nigel Clogg being our



Farm Fire Unit Co-ordinator for the Bundaleer Group, and helps to give farmers directions at a fire where their efforts can be best utilised in conjunction with CFS units at a fire.

Although the Laura CFS has a good number of members, many of our members work outside the township during weekdays, and this can sometimes mean we are unable to get enough members to crew our vehicles to attend a callout. Many of our callouts do not involve going to a fire, but other incidents such as assisting Ambulance officers to retrieving a patient out of their house into the Ambulance, or stopping traffic at a vehicle accident.

Our October meeting was held at the Wirrabara Sporting Complex with 34 members present and 5 apologies.

Guest Speaker was Ben Hall a detective who has been based at Port Augusta since 2015. His work covers a large area and involves a lot of travelling. Fraud and cybercrime affect older people, they mainly target 50+ age group and use charities, tax office, lottery and online shopping. Need to keep mobile phone secure and security around the house to prevent the opportunist person for example coming in through the front door and taking your purse and keys from the table.


In November we had Lynette and Ian Pole from the St. John Ambulance in Port Pirie. St. John came to Australia in the late 1900's. In 2020 their group has 4 adults and approx. 12 (11 – 18 yrs.) Cadets. They do not work on ambulances – attend a few events including bushfires or major events. They have a mobile first aid van, a large first aid caravan and an equipment trailer. Like everyone they need more helpers, first aiders and cadet helpers. Recommend that everyone should know where an AED defibrillator is located in each town. Using a defibrillator is very simple – anyone can use one and no training is required.

The St. John DRSABCD Action Plan is a vital aid in assessing whether a patient has any life threatening conditions and if any immediate first aid is necessary.



Australian Poets and Christmas

Recently Eudunda celebrated the 100th birthday of Colin Thiele, respected for his many publications, especially Sun on the Stubble which was a school text book, and the legendary Storm Boy. Another of Colin's works was Gemma's Christmas Eve, (published 1994) in which Gemma had great joy giving crumbs and leftovers to the insects and birds, and extra food for the farmyard animals as a Christmas present. After attending a church service and viewing the nativity scene she was reminded of the real meaning of Christmas.

Our own local son, CJ Dennis, also wrote of Christmas. **A Bush Christmas** was first published in the Melbourne Herald, on Christmas Eve 1931. The full version of **A Bush Christmas** will be posted on the local notice board, but here is a short extract.

"...and then dishevelled, hot and red, Mum, thro' the doorway puts her head And says, "This Christmas cooking, My! The sun's near fit for cooking by."

"Your fault," says Dad, "you know it is.
Plum puddin'! on a day like this,
And roasted turkeys! Spare me days,
I can't get over women's ways.
In climates such as this the thing's all wrong.
A bit of cold corned beef an' bread
Would do us very well instead."

It was just after 9am and the temperature is rising, only 38 degrees then. Locals are out doing their daily routine, running, walking the dog, riding the bike, it is only 38 degrees after all.

We sit on the church lawn under the shade of the trees and talk on things of life and faith, it is only 40 degrees now. The hot wind is blowing in from the north, but everyone is oblivious to that, there are more interesting things to talk about – God talk, Altjira in their language, or pepa (talking about the Book).

Big celebration is about to happen – Christmas. Families go bush, home to country. Whole family gets together to celebrate. That it is hot is irrelevant. Only difference is I know there are places down south where it is cooler. Here I sit in the afternoon and it has now reached 43 degrees – people are still out and about doing stuff.

If we were in the northern hemisphere, it would be cooler. Two thousand years ago, it was quite brisk and cold when that first momentous evening came along. It is amazing that an event two thousand years ago still holds sway on the calendar for peoples of many different tribes, races, and languages. For 2 billion people in the world it is a pivotal event. So the reason to celebrate.

What started with a simple birth of a child, a non-descript group of shepherds and a heavenly realm of angels, has become the foundation event for Christian's knowledge that there is a Saviour – one who was sent into the world to save.

You may not hear the cry of the baby, the sheep, the shepherds, or even the angels this Christmas, but the event still remains pivotal because it is the outflow of the promise, "Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord." Luke 2:11.
