Lions Club News

Covid-19 has had a distinct effect on the Club's fundraising through the sale of donuts during 2020. The cancellation last year of the Folk Fair and the uncertainty of crowds at the



footy/netball with the added Covid restrictions on the serving of food to the public meant not one donut was sold last year. The cancellation of the Folk Fair this year is disappointing but was the only decision that could be made. The Folk Fair Committee is to be commended on the efforts it has taken to work within the confines of the restrictions and uncertainties that still prevail.

Fortunately, the harvest has generally been good and the sale of sample grain at the Viterra Silo Complex in Gladstone has seen over 40 tonnes of grain delivered into the system by our Club's bins and trailers. Estimation of monies raised is in the vicinity of \$9,000 to \$10,000. We will know the exact figure when it is in the bank. These funds raised are earmarked for projects within the Rocky River district giving community benefit to the most residents. We thank Peter Smallacombe for volunteering to deliver the two grain trailers through the system and the very helpful Viterra staff who delivered the wheat, barley, peas, beans and canola in our five specialist bins.



Vandalism to Heritage Building

The heritage precinct in Hughes Street attracts many favourable comments from visitors to the town, as well as from some locals. Listed on the State Heritage Register since 1983 the former Court House (built in 1878) is the only building in Laura with such protection, and one of very few in the Northern Areas Council. Unfortunately, some unwanted vandalism has recently occurred to the former Court House, necessitating a police report.

Under the terms of the State Heritage Act, intentional damage to a registered place attracts significant fines and possible imprisonment. Anyone seeing any 'unusual activity' around this area is urged to contact our local police (8662 2001)

In the meantime the area will be under increased surveillance and any donations to the maintenance of the building may be made to Geoff Lange, Treasurer of Rocky River Historic & Art Society Inc.

I'm sure most of you have already heard that The Laura Fair will once again not be happening this year. Not a great decision to be made but with

restrictions still in place and not likely to change for some time we really had no other choice. Our location, our small population (which equates to number of people needed on the ground), the onerous tasks that would need to be achieved and then the ever present cloud hanging over everything at the moment of once again needing to cancel at the last minute and the costs that incurs all weighed heavily during the committee's deliberations. In the end the decision was made for us by our inability to conform to all the restrictions placed on events the size of The Laura Fair

This year we hope to be doing more fundraising so keep an eye and ear out for them. The Trading Table/Cake Stall we hope to hold at the end of April; Quiz Night in the middle of June; we have a couple of other ideas for the year but will keep you posted with those details in the next Laura Standard, our Facebook page and noticeboards. I am back - briefly...

One last opportunity to share with you something of Central Australia as the new parish pastor is installed in the Southern Flinders Parish. Words are a very powerful thing in most peoples lives. They either empower or deprive people of worth in their life – no more less so here in the Centre of Australia where you have the melting pot of many cultures. From one of the oldest indigenous cultures in the world, to multiple nationalities of Africa, South and North America, Asia, and Europe. To communicate across these cultures words are spoken, but is it not a given that they are understood by everybody else in the same way as the speaker.

So one is always working on the frontier of seeking to work together for better understanding, and that goes for all facets of the community, health and medical, education and training, policing, business, tourism, local government and the faith communities.

The Christian faith communities are one place where there is common ground in that they centre on a person – Jesus Christ.

In our worship we have people whose mother tongue is Arrarnta, Pitjantjatjarra, Pintupi/Luritja, Alyawarr, Anmatyerr, Kaytetye, and Warlpiri. These are just the local indigenous languages within 500klms or so of Alice, let alone all the other different nationalities and languages.

They come together regularly to hear a common voice, the voice of the Saviour as He speaks through the words of Scripture. As they pray together, as they sing together, and as they share in fellowship together. So worship is an exciting place to be when you realize that there is a lot more going on than what you see.

For centuries people have gathered around the words of Jesus and that is not likely to change any time soon – especially as ultimately humankind will be gathered together around that one voice when He returns. Listen for His voice. His words have the power to empower your life.
