Presidents Report 2020-2021

This year has again been a very tumultuous year for the brand name **RSLSA**, more so for the State HQ.

While just overcoming the mismanagement of the mid-late teens of this century we were plunged into the **COVID-19 VIRUS Epidemic**. The management of the RSLHQ has been exceptionally good over the last few years and now having to face this challenge will test all our resolve. The decline in opportunity for fund-raising and donation collection has made it extremely hard to meet commitments to our declared principles. One good outcome is the **Avoca Hotel** management/results, with a Covid-19 small business grant and patronage from local RSL members the business is a glimmer of light for the future. I attended a RSL-Presidents Forum at the Parade ground and was impressed with the enthusiasm of the management and attending personnel. Overall the RSLSA is in good hands for the future.

The Laura RSL monetary input to RSLHQ was markedly down this year due to lesser activity on **ANZAC Day & REMEMBRANCE Day.**

With the event of COVID-19 virus and the government Social distancing regulations RSLSA-HQ had to restrict the Memorial Services on both occasions in the city and country areas to light-vigils in city and suburbs. In Laura on **ANZAC Day** the RSL Exec Committee laid wreaths at dawn at the Cenotaph.

It was very heart warming and commendable to see the "light-vigil" in the main street of Laura on this day.

On **REMEMBRANCE Day** the government conditions were relaxed enough for us to participate in a Remembrance Service at the Cenotaph but social distancing prevented the after service social activities at the Club rooms.

The Barbara Kleinig Junior Art Award will also provide an opportunity for students of Gladstone High School and primary schools from the catchment area of Gladstone High to participate.



Can you believe that flooding was a problem for early Laura? It happened a hundred years ago in mid summer It happened eighty years ago in mid summer

In late February 1921 and late January 1941 flood waters from Pine Creek broke the banks which protect Laura from floods.

Floods also affected Laura in the 1870s, 1893, 1894, 1914, 1916 and 1919, with relatively minor flooding in 1975. The man made banks which surround the town on three sides have been a great asset since their construction in 1919.

However in January 1941 the ravaging waters of the Pine Creek broke the banks at the northern end of West Terrace and at South Laura on Tom Catt Hill Road on the way to the Catholic Church, flooding most of the township.

These two snippets from various sources give a little insight into the effects of the great flood of 1941 when businesses, homes and farming land were all affected.

"The 41 flood went through the house that Mum and Dad were in on West Terrace it came in through the kitchen window and Mum, six months pregnant, stood on the kitchen table and put the toddler on top of the kitchen dresser – must have been scary, and a filthy mess to clean up afterwards, and there wasn't any mains water at that time, just precious rain water."

- "...the paddocks near the town were not very productive for some years due to the build up of silt which had washed down the Pine Creek... held in by the embankment at the bridge where the tributary of the Pine Creek runs into the Rocky River."
- "...there were a few feet or so of water in the house which had to be cleaned out. It was just a fortnight or so before my parents were moving in to start their married life."

The media has reported on the devastation from the recent floods in New South Wales. It is timely to reflect on the aftermath of the Laura floods. In that era there were no generators, high pressure cleaners or efficient pumps which were needed to empty cellars and underground tanks which had been contaminated. Indeed Laura did not even have mains water, so all cleaning had to be done using well water or precious rain water.
