## Hello Readers,

Welcome to the June 2021 edition of The Laura Standard. It's hard to believe that we are already nearing the end of the financial year however it's been nice to see some long awaited, albeit small, opening rains.

With the easing of COVID19 restrictions continuing it's been great to see the town abuzz with tourists. Both the Caravan Park and the Laura Information Centre have been getting record numbers of visitors with the improvements at the Caravan Park showing great dividends and the addition of Golden North Giant Twins for sale at the Laura Information Centre are proving very popular. While it has been good to see things on the up in our community the recent COVID19 outbreak and subsequent lockdown in Victoria should serve as a reminder that everyone still needs to remain vigilant and that getting the majority of the population vaccinated is our best chance of life continuing to return to normal.

Stage 2 of the War Memorial Project was completed just in time for ANZAC Day this year and I'm sure that the large crowd that attended the Dawn Service would have been impressed with the progress so far. Stage 3 is now under way with a deposit being paid for the garden beds and seating to go on either side of the Cenotaph. With any luck these should be completed and installed in time for Remembrance Day this year. With this project nearing completion, the LCDTA has been keeping busy with other little improvements around the town such as planting pear trees (that were kindly donated) along the northern levee bank and purchasing plants to be planted in the drainage dam at the rear of the Northern Parklands. We have also ordered a directional sign to be installed at the Lookout and in the not too distant future will be looking to replace the bin surrounds in the main street.


The plan is to tidy up the 4 median strips in the main street including mulching, removal of some unwanted plants and replacing them with new plants.

## An airport for Laura?

Just a hundred years ago in 1921, as well as being concerned about flood protection, electricity supply, and the completion of the war memorial, the Laura Corporation lobbied the Commonwealth Government for Laura to be a place approved for the landing of aeroplanes. With great vision for the future of aviation it was claimed that Laura should be one of the established stopping places of the overland route in SA...but alas we are still waiting!

The elected members and staff of local government generally endeavour to do their best for the residents. Our early local governments operated in a difficult climate and despite a lack of money were visionary. The Laura Corporation, formed in 1882, instigated a tree planting scheme at one of the first meetings, ordering 500 trees. In 1906 Laura became one of the first towns in the state to have street lighting (with acetylene gas).

The lobbying for an airfield was minimal compared to the efforts many years earlier to procure a rail connection for the town. As the northern agricultural lands were opened up in the 1870s as a result of what was known as the Strangways Act of 1869 an efficient means of transport was needed for the harvests

Laura as we know was established in 1872, and in 1874 a Committee of the Legislative Council took evidence at Laura, concluding that a railway was desirable. However lack of government action resulted in a private company being established in 1877 to construct a line. Lack of capital thwarted this unique endeavour and finally in 1884 a government railway line was opened to Laura as a result of an Act of Parliament of 1882. This Act had originally recommended a line from Gladstone through Laura to Appila, but was later amended. The people of Appila had first appealed for a rail connection in 1874, with their last effort in 1924

Many other proposals were put forward at various public meetings including;

- 1889 a line from Laura to Caltowie in preference to the zig zag line from Gladstone to Caltowie.
- 1909 Running a spur line down Herbert Street for the convenience of passengers.
- 1914 Value of constructing the transcontinental line through Wilmington to Port Augusta.

Laura remained the railhead until 1910 when the line was extended to Booleroo Centre, and then in 1915 to Wilmington. The last train ran in 1988.
