Hello Readers,

Welcome to the Winter edition of the Laura Standard. After a late start to the season it has been great to finally see some good rains, with the landscape looking green, and everyone's crops and gardens looking good, it really is an amazing time of year to live in our district.

The recent outbreak of COVID 19 in Sydney is a reminder to us all that despite the good fortune we have had in our region we are certainly not out of the woods yet. With it now having spread to Adelaide, our State Government have decided to jump early and enforce a lockdown. While to some this may seem over cautious, you have to wonder if the NSW Government had done a similar thing would they be in the same predicament they find themselves in? As the vaccine roll out continues to ramp up hopefully in the future these lockdowns will be a distant memory but until then we all need to remain vigilant.

IT'S TIME FOR DOG REGISTRATION RENEWALS!

A dog registered and wearing identification can be returned to its rightful owner much quicker which means that there is less stress on both the animal and owner.

The original discs issued with dog registrations are lifetime discs and owners are encouraged to ensure the dog wears the appropriate disc or wears a collar or metal tag with the dog's registration number printed on it.

Dog registration are due to be paid by 31st August 2021. Renewals can be paid through the DACO system. If you have already registered an animal in the DACO system please ensure that additional animals are added to **that** profile and a new profile isn't created.

As well as caring for your dog or cat you have responsibilities to comply with legislation under the Dog and Cat Management Act 1995. For example **All** dogs and cats must be microchipped and those born after 1st July 2018 must be also desexed (exemptions apply to working dogs and animals owned by registered breeders) and as an owner you must ensure that microchip details are entered in www.dogsandcatsonline.com.au the State-wide dog and cat register for animals and breeders. These laws were introduced for good reason – to reduce unwanted litters and return animals home quicker should they be lost.

Although it is a legislated requirement for dogs and cats to be microchipped, it is important to realise that microchipping your animal <u>DOES NOT</u> replace Council registration.

Diabetes Screening Project



Rocky River Lions and the SA Diabetes Awareness and Screening Project was held in the Laura Civic Centre on Thursday 10th June. Ten of these screening days, with the support of Lions volunteers and Diabetes SA staff were held around the state. Laura's event was the tenth and was geared to cover the Southern Flinders.

The objectives of the project were:

- to raise awareness of risk factors within rural communities and the significance of early detection and prevention of type 2 diabetes.
- increase access to information, resources and health services for early detection and screening to prevent or at least delay the onset of type 2 diabetes.
- promote the AUSDRISK self-risk assessment tool so individuals can identify and understand their risk of developing type 2 diabetes. to refer people who have been identified as being high risk or receive an indicative result of type 2 diabetes to their local medical professional for further advice and treatment where required.

Results from the ten different locations across the state, including Laura, were fairly consistent. Importantly, the results indicated that 50% of the people who completed the AUSDRISK Assessment, returned a risk factor considered HIGH. 10% of those who then had the blood test returned a sugar level that confirmed they were a Type 2 Diabetic and were <u>totally unaware</u> of it. That is 5 people in 100 tested did not know it. This could well be a life changing (even life saving) result for those people.

Heritage Tourism and us


The proverbial 'Blind Freddy' could not be oblivious to the increase in tourism in our region during the past year or so when international and some interstate travel has been restricted. Consequently visitor numbers to our town and the caravan park have increased considerably.

It behoves the government to throw some funding behind the plan, and for our community organizations to embrace any available opportunities. LAURA RSL SUB-BRANCH ACTIVITY REPORT.



On the 10thJuly this year I attended the 103rd ANNUAL SUB-BRANCH CONFERENCE at the Drill Hall Torrens Training Depot. Attending dignitaries included the Governor of South Australia, the Premier, and numerous Members of the National Government and Opposition. If attendance at the meeting is any indication of the health of the RSL within this State, we are doing fine.

It was reported that the numbers of members have dropped-off marginally but that could be due to the COVID-19 problem. Affiliate Members are now becoming vital to the continuance and well-being of the RSL within the State. This shows more in the country areas with smaller RSL's and its devastating to see a few more have succumbed and closed their doors. I can only say be mindful of the Laura RSL. The State RSL Financial Report shows we are financially sound and may be well over problems from the past era. The patronage of the Avoca Hotel and excellent management of this enterprise is contributing to our financial status.

The Hon David Fawcett in his speech referred to the state of "the world today" and we should be very mindful of the RSL motto "The price of liberty is eternal vigilance".

A future major concern facing us arose in a speech by WO1 Hortle. In the next few years new equipment will come online in all Military services, the problem, - shortage of personnel in all three branches and the civilian work force. Recruiting is already having problems meeting numbers and Intelligence levels. It was noted a large part of the Defence Spending over this period will be in South Australia.

The State RSL after months of consultation with members changed the State Constitution to be consistent in format to that of the National Constitution. The Laura RSL had a very quiet first six months of this year, our ANZAC DAY ceremony was very well attended even though we were limited in our activities by the COVID-19 regulations. It was a pleasure to have a contingent from the Laura Primary School lay wreaths at the shrine.




Barbara Kleinig Junior Art Award 2021

Northern Areas Council Economic and Population Growth Plan Workshops

The Northern Areas Council have recently adopted a sub strategy known as the Northern Areas Expansion Project, which is aimed at boosting the local economy through attracting people to relocate to the region. Council is seeking your input in helping to make this happen.

A working party consisting of Cr Denise Higgins, Cr Leon Pollard, RDA Yorke and Mid North Economic Development Officer Hayley Trott and Council's Manager, Community Development James Lang has put together the strategy. The Project

The aim of this strategy is to encourage people to move to the Northern Areas Council, creating a boost to the local economy creating further jobs and growth. Specifically targeting Working Families and Retirees or Semi-Retirees.

There are 5 themes to the project including:

- 1. Improve Perceptions and Better Promote the Northern Areas Council District
- 2. Inclusive and Purpose-Built Infrastructure
- 3. There are places for people to live, rent, buy, and build a home
- 4. The Business Community is Innovative and Proactive
- 5. The Northern Areas Council is a place people want to live

Workshops

An evening and a day workshop had been earmarked to occur in mid August, however in light of recent Covid Safe restrictions they are to be rescheduled once restrictions allow this to occur. Should things progress positively they may occur slightly later in the month. Both workshops will be the same, the idea of two workshops is to better enable more community involvement at suitable times.




