

Annual Green Waste Collection

25th October to 1st November 2021

This collection service is primarily aimed to assist the elderly and the incapacitated.

Council's Annual Green Waste Collection will be held from Monday 25th October 2021 until Monday 1st November 2021.

Please note that the Green Waste Collection will work on a booking system only. All bookings must be made by COB Friday October 22nd 2021.

Residents must ring Council offices to book a collection: Jamestown 86641139; Gladstone 8662 2018; Spalding 8845 2017

The Green waste that will be collected is tree, rose and bush type material only, no lawn clippings or weeds. Green waste to be collected must be placed on the edge of the roadway, the evening prior to your scheduled pickup. No repeat trips will be made and large piles will not be removed from private property.

Green waste must be placed so that it does not interfere with pedestrian or vehicular traffic and must not be placed over service pits or hinder access to fire hydrants. No tyres, no cars, no chemical. A limit of 3 cubic metres (i.e. 8x4 trailer load) per household will be allowed.

Council reminds residents of their obligation to prune trees overhanging the footpaths. This is a good opportunity to do so.

Unity or division?



Have you notice how divided the world is at the moment. There are the divisions between countries – for example the ongoing trade spat between Australia and China (and France now that the submarine deal has been cancelled). There is the division between the pro and anti vax supporters for COVID, let alone the raft of other minor differences such as which football team you support.

We have a tendency to seek out those who have similar views to us, because that is where we are comfortable. We don't like to be challenged or have our views on various topics questioned. It can be very uncomfortable and difficult to understand someone with a totally different set of values.

You only need to watch two sets of footy fans at a game to see how this works out in practice – the umpire makes a decision and the two sets of fans have totally different views if that decision was right or wrong – regardless of what the rules of the game actually say!

Those two sets of fans are focused on what separates them – their support for a particular team, rather than focusing on what brings them together – their love and passion for the game of football!

How often do we do that in our lives? Focusing on the differences we have with people rather than what we have in common.

Focusing on our differences rather than what we have in common is nothing new – Jesus had the same problem. When he tried to correct what those in charge were teaching, rather than listening to him or trying to understand where he was coming from, they had Jesus put to death.

However, it was through his death that Jesus draws people to him. On that cross Jesus died in your place – for all the times that you have not shown the understanding and tolerance to those who have different view to you and all your other wrongs as well.

On that cross Jesus died for all people, for those in every country in the world for vaxxers and for anti vaxxers, for Port supporters and for Crows supporters – he died for all people! Because each and every person is so precious to him that he died for them. Because he wants to spend eternity with each and every one of you!
