A Treasure of Laura

There are many nice items in the public domain in Laura, such as in the churches, the RSL Hall and in the Laura Archives. A real gem is one that many of us have admired during our school days, whilst others in the community have never seen it. The beautiful Honour Roll at the Laura Primary School recognizes the sixteen former students and one teacher who paid the Supreme Sacrifice and 119 others who enlisted in the Great War.

A Souvenir of the unveiling of the Honour Roll on Friday 1 August 1919 has recently been donated to the Laura Archives. These small folders could be purchased for 3d, or posted anywhere for 4d.

A flower and cake show and concert held in the Town Hall in the previous November enabled the committee to place an order for an honour roll which would be 'a credit to the town and district'.

During the 'impressive ceremony of historic value' it was claimed that the memorial was 'one of the finest which has been unveiled outside the metropolitan area'. It was unveiled by the Attorney General (HN Barwell) in the presence of Member for Stanley (RD Nicholls) who had motored from Clare. The Head Teacher, Mr JC Richardson was a prime mover of this project which was being planned even before the end of the war. The lengthy report in the Laura Standard of the proceedings along with the names of all on the memorial, was delayed for a week, as the 'flue fiend got a strong one on us last week and rendered us unfit for service' (but it wasn't the Spanish Flu)

SNOW AT LAURA.

Laura Standard and Crystal Brook Courier, Friday 12 September 1919, page 3

Residents of Laura who were early risers on Sunday were privileged to see a sight which well repaid them for their effort — namely, that of seeing the Beetaloo Hills, the hills to the east, and Mount Herbert, to the south of the town, mantled with snow. Never in the memory of the oldest inhabitant of the district has such a fine sight been witnessed here, and to Young Australia in particular what is a novel experience. A very cold snap set in on Saturday afternoon, which was followed by a hailstorm during the evening, but the sight which was presented during the early hours of Sunday morning was a surprise to everybody who witnessed it. From information received, the fall took place between the hours of six and eight o'clock, and a good deal of excitement was created as the news circulated that snow had fallen and could be seen on the hills. Snow balling and the making of snow men were indulged in, and in sheltered places hailstones were to be found till late in the afternoon. Between Saturday, 9 a.m., and Sunday, 9 a.m., 55 points of rain were registered as having fallen at the local Post Office. This was followed by further showers on Sunday, making the total for 43 hours 72 points. These showers will prove very beneficial to the crops in the district, which, in the opinion of visitors, are looking as well as any in the State, and far more advanced and promising than in many parts.




