LAURA RSL SUB-BRANCH ANNUAL REPORT 2022-23



This year has been a little less than the ordinary due to the slow run down of the Covid restrictions. To protect our aged members, we obeyed all the covid-guidelines issued from the Northern Areas Council to minimalize the chances of infection. We also kept our required general meetings to minimum to lessen the chances of cross-infection in our aged members. With this in mind two issues arose to test us, those being. Resurrecting our Remembrance Day Ceremonies to Pre COVID standards and the introduction of a new Constitution for RSLSA.

Firstly, due to the strong military conscience of our district the attendance at the **ANZAC DAY** and **REMEMBRANCE DAY** ceremonies indicate that our past Military history will never be forgotten.

The attendance of the **Laura Primary School pupils** at the Remembrance Day ceremony must make us all proud. The laying of the wreaths, their conduct at the Clubroom BBQ, their interest in the memorabilia should give us all faith in the future of our country. **Well done students and teachers**.

The second issue that confronts the Sub-Branch may become a major issue, not only for Laura RSL but most country RSLs. The new Constitution that was adopted in December 2022 to bring us in line with the Eastern States may have adverse ramifications on small country RSL Sub-Branch status. The outcome of these deliberations will come to fruition at the **Annual Sub-Branch Conference in Adelaide on June/July 2023.** Not withstanding the outcome of this conference due to age, health, and departure from district of Service members, our numbers (Service Members) are dwindling to a critical stage to operate as a Sub-Branch (ten Service Members required) at the moment we have fourteen, soon to be eleven, if the Constitution is enforced, and we must presume it will be, we must soon consider the future of our RSL.

This year at the Laura RSL AGM Heather and I were elected again Treasurer/Secretary and President with the understanding that we will not stand for these positions again. Heather has served 15+ years on the Women's Auxiliary and 11 years as Secretary/Treasurer and I am in my 21st year as President. The new By-Laws may help us on our way if not changed and enforced.

For the eighteenth consecutive year our members thoroughly enjoyed the **North Laura Hotel** Xmas Dinner thanks to **Mr. Peter Condon, AJ, Georgie, Chef Dan and Staff**. No better meal was served in the North in such an excellent venue with wonderful hospitality, a definite highlight of the year again.

You don't need to be ill or have an ongoing health condition to register with and therefore receive your MAC number. Consider it insurance!! You will be one step closer to getting support when you need it.

To register you can ring 1800 422 200 or apply online at **myagecare.gov.au/apply-online**. If ringing, you may need to wait for about half hour for your call to be answered by a very helpful staff member. The call centre is open from 8am – 8pm Monday to Friday and 10am – 2 pm on Saturday.
