The LCDTA has been in consultation with Golden North over the last year or so about getting some new Town Entrance signs made. These have recently arrived and will be installed at the North, South and West entrances. Please keep an eye out for these in the coming months.

A new light has recently been installed at the Nita Klemm gardens, with thanks to Nettle Electrical for completing this. This light needed to be replaced after the original light was vandalised some months ago and it has been disappointing to have reports of the new light already being swung on by some younger members of our community. The LCDTA is now considering setting up security cameras at these gardens and the charity bins as it takes a lot of fundraising and volunteer hours to provide these facilities for our town.

The Nature Playground project has had a very successful year of fundraising and is forging ahead with a business plan being written in preparation for some upcoming grants. The LCDTA is also looking to spend some money at the North Parklands with plans in the pipeline for a basketball half court and an outdoor table tennis table. This project will hopefully be done in conjunction with the Rocky River Lions Club.

The Laura Fair recently held their AGM with a new committee being elected. After the success of this year there is plenty of optimism for next year's Fair which will now be held on the second weekend in April to avoid a clash with the AFL's Gather Round. Meals on Wheels (MoW) SA was founded in 1954 by Doris Taylor MBE. Since then, over 50 million meals have been delivered to South Australians. Here in Laura we have been delivering meals for 42 years. While there are more than 8000 volunteers in the state there are currently 63 volunteers and reserve volunteers who support the delivery of meals in Laura.

Key to MoW is not just delivering food but includes "check and chat". Stopping to talk with each customer is an ideal way to make sure they are "doing okay". A recent survey identified that the check and chat supports the wellbeing of both the customer and the volunteer. – See MoW website for details. <u>https://www.mealsonwheelssa.org.au/latest/news</u> Much of the organisation of MoW is now based in MoW Adelaide Head Office.

Being organised locally is part of what makes MoW successful in our community. We no longer have formal meetings but get together twice a year to check everything is going okay and once to celebrate our volunteers. Laura - a town of many monikers

Through its 150 years Laura has had many descriptions; a pretty town, Garden of the Northern Areas, town with the nice main street etc. In 1932 for the Laura Jubilee, CJ Dennis wrote the poem, *Laura Days*, with his memories of Laura in the 1890s as *'a little town that nestles down by the hills of Beetaloo'*.

The two titles that have been evergreens are;

Laura, A Town of Bridges,

Laura, A Town of Churches (much like Adelaide continues to be dubbed as the City of Churches)

With bridges on three entrances to the town, and with five churches, both are logical tags. We have taken for granted that until recent times that there have been five Christian churches in Laura, probably not realizing that many other larger towns may only have four or even less. Indeed in earlier times there were two streams of Methodism, the Wesleyan Methodists and the Primitive Methodists.

But it is not generally known that the Salvation Army had a presence in the early days of Laura. The *War Cry* of June 1884 reported that an outpost had been established which became known as the 29th Corps, headed by Captain and Mrs Robert Scown. He was one of the first Army converts in Adelaide and presumably SA.

However before 1884 there had been a presence in Laura as reported in the Adelaide Express and Telegraph of 29 August 1883. 'The Salvation Army's influence appears to have reached here. Tonight a number of respectable persons marched in procession with lighted lamps through the main streets singing temperance melodies, and finishing up at the Methodist Chapel, where an evangelistic service was conducted. Everything was very orderly'.

The media did not give the Salvos good press in Laura, inferring that the nightly processions were encouraging larrikinism and demoralising young children. In 1885 it was reported in the *South Australian Weekly Chronicle* that '*The local branch of the Salvation Army has…been growing smaller* through degrees and beautifully less, till at last it has expired through sheer inanition'. And finally after its closure it was reported that '*Our*

township is now comparatively free from the larrikinism so rampant...

I believe this is owing to the collapse of the local branch of the Salvation *Army*'.

So much for unbiased journalism even 140 years ago !

So bearing in mind the great works that the Salvos do please think kindly of them when approached by collectors at the pub, or at the time of the Red Shield Appeal.



Our Artists and their Art Forms

Laura and near areas has an abundance of talented individuals and groups who contribute to our and the wider community. Today is the first of a series of regular articles in the Standard where we meet these people, learning about them and their art.

For this series of articles art forms will include not just visual and performing arts but what many would consider to be craft - for example the community's patch-workers.

Our first artist fits firmly in the visual arts category, focussing on painting, drawing and sculpture.

Joan McDonald was 90 last month and was presented with a Certificate of Appreciation from the RRHAS for her long

contribution to the community of Laura at a celebration held earlier in July.

Joan was born in Scotland 90 years ago, married and had six children. The family came to Australia in 1949, disembarking into the Sydney heat of Boxing Day. Prior to her marriage she studied commercial art and life drawing.

Joan's passions are painting and sculpture with lead lighting and stained glass windows among her other talents. Joan remembers drawing horses on the wall paper of the family home when she was five years old and starting her sculpture work with plasticine.



After twelve years in Western Australia Joan and now partner James arrived in Laura in the summer of 1989 and bought the property in Henry St, Laura where they developed the Walnut Tree Gallery.

Joan is proud of the Gallery building which displays ingenuity and is in part a memorial to other old buildings in Laura. The staircase once belonged in the old Flour Mill and windows that were once part of the Laura Post Office. As she looks around her studio she talks about where many of the items came from. The outside of the gallery has many imaginative touches, from stained glass windows to the electricity meter being housed behind an old bakery oven door. There are touches of whimsy - like the tea pot and mugs set into the wall and a gate made out of a pair of bed heads.

Joan has a passion for community and involved herself in a range of organisations. She reminisced about being part of the choir that sang at the Christmas street party, when the choir stood on the flat top trailer belonging to the Schmidt family. "I met so many different people when I got here". Joan spent time teaching art at the Laura Primary School, teaching privately in her studio and being involved in regional art exhibitions.

IT'S TIME FOR DOG REGISTRATION RENEWALS!



A dog registered and wearing identification can be returned to its rightful owner much quicker which means that there is less stress on both the animal and owner.

The original discs issued with dog registrations are lifetime discs and owners are encouraged to ensure the dog wears the appropriate disc or wears a collar or metal tag with the dog's registration number printed on it. Dog registration renewals are due to be paid by 31st August 2023.

Renewals can be paid through the DACO system. If you have already registered an animal in the DACO system please ensure that additional animals are added to **that** profile and a new profile isn't created.

As well as caring for your dog or cat you have responsibilities to comply with legislation under the Dog and Cat Management Act 1995. For example **All** dogs and cats must be microchipped and those born after 1_{st} July 2018 must be also desexed (exemptions apply to working dogs and animals owned by registered breeders) and as an owner you must ensure that microchip details are entered in www.dogsandcatsonline.com.au the State-wide dog and cat register for animals and breeders. These laws were introduced for good reason – to reduce unwanted litters and return animals home quicker should they be lost.

Although it is a legislated requirement for dogs and cats to be microchipped, it is important to realise that microchipping your animal DOES NOT replace Council registration.

Northern Areas Council does not charge registration fees for cats but encourages cat owners to abide by the Dog and Cat Management Act which requires their cat to be registered in DACO. Anyone who sells puppies or kittens they've bred (including accidental litters) must be registered in Dogs and Cats Online—that's the law. When registered, they're given a breeder registration (DACO) number which must appear in sale advertisements. So if you're buying a dog or cat, pop online to www.dogsandcatsonline.com.au and do a 'Breeder Search' first to check their registration.

No sport on the weekends? Are you considering renovations at home. Are you planning for warmer weather? Have you carried out renovations without checking to see what is legally required?

If you are considering extensions, renovations, a new shed for those handyman or craft projects or perhaps a swimming pool, pergola and deck to enjoy those lazy summer days and to keep the kids amused please contact Council prior to commencing any work to check if you need to complete a Development application.

If you have carried out work and are concerned that it may have required a permit, please contact council for advice. Work that is unapproved has the potential to be identified and lead to legal action if not built to standard. Safety issues, especially with swimming pools and appropriate pool fencing, have recently led to the Coroner reminding Councils of their obligations towards inspections of swimming pools.

When a house is sold, unapproved building works have the potential to cause new owners both mental and financial stress when the work carried out is found not to be up to the building code standards.

Council's Planning and Building staff are always happy to discuss your projects and work with you to achieve a successful outcome.

Many others are still welcoming us and serving our needs after twenty or thirty years.


