



The Courthouse Gallery

The Courthouse Gallery doesn't just sit idle as many people may think. The Laura Collection of paintings amassed from the past 46 annual art exhibitions is normally on display and open for occasional viewings. Our annual exhibition is one of the longest running exhibitions in regional SA. Recently Dr Graham Ellender, a Senior Lecturer of the Adelaide School of Dentistry hosted a community consultation relating to a research project. Just after The Laura Fair the Wends/Sorb Society of SA will be visiting the Gallery and the Laura Archives. About 2,000 Wendish people came to Australia from Eastern Germany between 1848 and 1860. In October the Courthouse Gallery will host the launch of a biography of a former Laura resident.

During The Laura Fair artists from across South Australia will display artworks in the 47th annual exhibition.

The exhibition will be open during both days of the fair, but don't leave it till the last minute to have a look as from mid afternoon on Sunday artists may be removing their works prior to travelling homewards: and it may be too late to purchase an art work.

Any offers of assistance as doorkeepers at the gallery over the weekend would be appreciated, just for an hour or so would be great.




LAURA CARAVAN PARK DEVELOPMENT

The Laura Community Caravan Park committee have been planning to do upgrades at the park. A major upgrade that is about to take place is the installation of a new ablution block with disabled access facilities incorporated into it. The new facility is going to be located near cabin 1, facing the tree walk and the newly established lawn area. The cost of the project is estimated at around \$200,000. This includes the building, fixtures and the site work that will need to be done prior.

We are looking for support from Northern Areas Council, and also our community to help fund this project. The caravan park is getting many great reviews and patronage has increased in the past few years. We have many other smaller upgrades around the park so we can continue to attract visitors to our beautiful town.

Sew Together – A Social Group that Sews!

Artists and their Art Forms this edition focusses on not an individual but a group of sewers from diverse backgrounds, – bringing an extensive range of knowledge, interests, skills and talents to the group.

When part of your reason for getting together is just that – getting together for the social and well-being of each other then it is not just a sewing group......

They are a community of sewers from seven towns who meet in Laura at the Sporting Reserve every Monday from just after 9am until about 4pm. Their view is that people come and go when they are ready. They believe it continues to thrive as there is no expectation for people to conform. What was once a patchwork group is now a sewing group/social group, with some still predominantly doing patchwork and quilting. Others are making items for gifting or for sale.

The group started 25 years ago in the Church of England Hall at Crystal Brook with 8 people.

They are a self-supporting group of more than 20 and are affiliated with the Quilters Guild, costing each member \$6 a year for an insurance cover. Each member pays \$5 a week when they attend. This covers hire of the building and ongoing tea and coffee. You will see in one of the photos the table raisers, made by Trish Belcher's husband Frank. Making tables the ideal height for cutting fabric.

Community is an important part of the group, with birthday morning teas and lunch at the local Hotel each month being part of the way the group bonds together. Networking means that members have the opportunity to chat, to ask and answer questions. Everyone is valued and often very knowledgeable within their focus area. Sharing their particular knowledge with others is a pleasure.

Each year they extend their learning with a 3-day retreat, often with workshops. The retreat is held at the Sporting Reserve Building with this year's dates and projects still to be decided.




Meals to You

In a culture that can sometimes seem more critical than encouraging, it's refreshing when people are publicly honoured. At this year's Australia Day celebrations Barry Harvie was awarded the Northern Areas Council Citizen of the Year. A worthy recipient. But in keeping with his character, Barry was surprised when he was told of the award. Humility is one of the qualities we admire about him. Humility is in fact, the hallmark of *all* genuine service.

In one of his letters, the apostle Paul quotes a song which underscores the relationship between humility and service. It's a beautiful description of Jesus Christ "who, though he was God, did not think of equality with God as something to cling to.
