Hello Readers,

Welcome to the June 2024 edition of The Laura Standard. It's been a busy couple of months, with Football and Netball seasons now in full swing and Sowing Season ramping up despite one of the driest starts to a year in living memory. Cold mornings have been followed by days of "beautiful living weather", but let's hope for some rain in the not too distant future.

The Laura Fair was held on the second weekend of April this year, due to a clash with the AFL's Gather Round. Fantastic weather again drew a massive crowd (15000 on Saturday and 7000 on Sunday) who were treated to a great variety of stalls and top-notch entertainment over the 2 days. The LCDTA's Devonshire Tea stall was again a great success as I'm sure many other local community groups fundraising efforts would have been.

The Nature Playground group have also had a busy couple of months, selling nearly 530 Mother's Day Raffle tickets, raising just over \$2100 in what was another wonderfully supported raffle by local businesses this year. Seeking an alternate quote and meetings with Council have the project heading in the right direction and hopefully all the hard work in the background will start to come to fruition soon. They have had a small, albeit fantastic, win recently though, as it was members of their group who sought, and won, an SA Water grant for the drinking fountain that was recently installed at the North Parklands. The fountain looks great and has already seen plenty of use, indicating that it was a long overdue addition to that area of our town.

Although Simon and Naomi are on holidays as this report is being written, our wonderful managers have been very busy as business is booming. With the opening of Little Blessings Brewing we look forward to increased patronage at the park.

Easter and The Laura Fair filled the park to capacity and it has continued to be busy since.

Ken and Kathleen Shilling, with help from Mark and Jo Opram, have been doing an excellent job of managing the park during Naomi and Simon's absence. We appreciate the support these 2 couples are giving to the park.

However, we must not forget how important the volunteers are to the running of our park. During April twenty people have been involved in various chores including general clean up jobs, firewood cutting, digging post holes and erecting poles for a shelter shed. Other tasks include taking levels for our new ablution block pad, trimming trees and taking rubbish away. There has also been an application for a grant from which we were successful in gaining some funding to assist with the cost of the ablution block. There is also dealing with compliance paperwork and much more.

We have made a new connection to the mains water from North Terrace and are most thankful to Wayne Palmer for the trenching that he has done free of cost.

The Service Plan for Crystal Brook, Laura, Gladstone and Port Broughton is now available.

The 5 – 10-year Service Plan is a detailed blueprint for how the Yorke and Northern Local Health Network will align and grow services to meet changing community needs while making the most effective use of available and future resources.

The plan provides information on the current and projected health needs of Crystal Brook, Laura, Gladstone and Port Broughton (including hospital, Country Health Connect and mental health services) and contains evidence-based service models, outlining recommendations for service improvement to support the best health outcomes for the community.

Some of the key priorities for the first year include: improving security in our emergency departments and health services, improving our promotion of our statewide telephone services, continuing to review our infrastructure to provide safe accessible services, continuing to improve our staff accommodation, improving our Transitional Care Package model of service and implementing electronic medical records.

Thank you to everyone involved, including community members, who gave us valuable feedback via a survey. Your feedback has been integral to understanding the health needs important to the community.

We will update the community throughout the plan's implementation.

# Artists and their Art Forms

This edition – a craft person and her use of technology.

Meet Pam Hogben, a retired teacher who lives in Beetaloo Valley. Her passion is "preserving the memory" through the safe storage and utilisation of photos, videos and audio files.

Pam started out as a scrapbooker, moving to digital scrapbooking, enabling her to collect and keep not just photos with comments attached but also video and audio memories.

Pam recalls the positive impact her virtual community had on her and many others during COVID. Being home did not mean being alone. Her community is worldwide and post COVID she regularly visits both interstate and New Zealand friends. She even has a client in Montana USA. "You can be anywhere and be connected. It has given me a strong sense of family."

The program she uses and highly recommends for her digital scrapbooking is Artisan, having started with its predecessor StoryBook Creator. She is a lead ambassador for FOREVER, the company who sells and supports this software. In this role she provides support for 14 ambassadors across Australia and New Zealand. Due to her enthusiasm in helping others to learn how to use Artisan, she set up and manages a Facebook group enabling sharing ideas and techniques. She believes Artisan is easy to learn in a community where everyone helps everyone and gets excited about everyone's achievements.

Her artistic abilities show through in her pages, books and even a blanket. There are a few local people who join Pam for scrapbooking / digital scrapbooking days and Pam is happy to see that group grow.

While chatting with Pam, she showed me some of her coffee table books and spoke of joy they bring her grandchildren in particular.

Pam emphasized that anyone who has precious photos on a mobile phone would benefit strongly from having FOREVER storage for peace of mind. Once purchased the FOR-EVER storage belongs to the purchaser and their family for at least 100 years after the death of the purchaser.

When I was a kid, one of my dad's good friends would visit from time to time. I called him Uncle Clem. He never married, had a good job on the wharfs at Pt. Adelaide, and spent his money taking trips overseas. So each time he came to dinner (especially at Christmas) he would



arrive bearing gifts for us, and me, souvenirs from his latest overseas jaunt, along with tall tales and true of his adventures. It all seemed to me - being the child of a working class family - very exotic, even if they were mostly about England.

So I always looked forward to his visits, knowing that I would get something out of it; another story to fire my imagination, and a present. My appreciation knew no bounds.

It took a few years of growing up for me to understand that there was somebody *behind* these gifts, someone who had paid a price for them, out of love for me and my family. I came to realise that his love for us *was* the gift, and the souvenirs were tangible evidence of that love. It took me even longer to understand that *he himself* was the most precious gift of all.

I had a lot of growing up to do, from a child who simply accepted the gifts without question, and politely said the 'magic words,' (you know the ones - "Thank you.") to being open to heartfelt gratitude for his simply being my uncle.

This understanding has grown in me to encompass all that I experience and see around me. Here in the country we have a lot to be thankful for in our surroundings. Here we are closer to the natural wonders than our city cousins. And I have found that constantly giving thanks to the one who has gifted us for even our lives, is a joy, and brings its own rewards in wellbeing and hope, that gets us through the tough times.

Uncle Clem gave me tangible gifts, as well as a vision for travel into unknown places, new experiences, that I could aspire to. He gave me hope.

God has graciously and freely given us this amazing world as a gift. Everything we have and are has been paid at the cost of Jesus, his Son's life. Getting to know him is the greatest privilege I know.

Having lived in this neck of the woods for some years now, and receiving God's gifts of kangaroos in the local park, and flocks of galahs at sunrise, and paddocks of canola, when anyone asks me why I believe in God, my answer is, "Well, for one thing, I just want to have someone to thank for all this."
