

The Keipert Connection

The recent unveiling of the monument and sign for the Keipert Crown Foundry was a success

backing of Rocky River Historic & Art Society assisted by a Northern Areas Council Community Grant. The late Jim Hawkett of Limberlost was also an advocate for this recognition.

About forty members of the Keipert family from Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria and South Australia gathered in Laura for the unveiling of the monument.

The occasion coincided with the 140th anniversary of the citizenship of Heinrich Johann Keipert who came to Laura in 1878 as manager of implement manufacturer Forsaith & Daniels. He later purchased the business and erected new premises on the corner of Herbert Street and South Terrace. Henry Keipert developed the foundry which employed up to fifty staff producing a range of products of which ploughshares were the mainstay. (read the sign for more info!)

A significant aspect of the day was the strong attendance of locals at the unveiling. This local welcome was especially gratifying to members of the Keipert family, as it is almost ninety years since the Keipert's had left our town.

The Keipert monument is the second of an ongoing project recognizing the Industrial Heritage of Laura. The first was unveiled during the 150th celebrations of Laura, recognizing the enterprise of Forsaith & Daniels.

Artists and their Art Forms

Kate Sleath – Metal Whimsey In this edition of The Laura Standard we meet Kate Sleath whose passion is Metal upcycling (Whimsey).




Kate's work in metal began about 10 years ago. She was inspired to start when she saw a plasma cutter in a neighbour's shed. – a plasma cutter is a hand held cutting tool needing an air compressor, a power supply and a steady hand. Kate is adamant that the plasma cutter is easy to use.

Her art is inspired by patterns and shapes particularly those found on things like greeting cards, wall paper and occasionally Pinterest. Kate draws on her metal object in chalk, rubs out and redraws until she is happy with the shapes and styles she has developed. She then hand cuts with the plasma cutter. "It's fun to turn scrap into rusty garden art."

Kate's workshop is an open shed, overlooking a dam. – "It's not unusual to get a goanna wandering through" Kate says.

She upcycles rusty metal into some of what you see here. Kate will use anything from rusty galvanised iron, saws, shovels, buckets, bread tins, tool boxes and the list goes on. At one time she repurposed an old Singer sewing machine into amazing garden ornaments.

Remembrance Day

Remembrance Day on 11 November is also known as **Armistice Day** It marks the end of World War One, at 11am on the 11th day of the 11th month in 1918.

Traditionally a two-minute silence is held at 11am on 11/11 to remember those who died in wars.

CJ Dennis is known as the creator of the Sentimental Bloke. He also contributed a regular column to the Melbourne *Herald* about items of current interest; similar to the writings of Max Fatchen in *The* Advertiser. Through the 1920s and until his death in 1938 CJ penned tributes for Anzac Day and Armistice Day.

This poem, **Two Minutes**, was first published in *The Herald*, on 11 November 1931. It describes the emotions of war and victory, but more poignantly drew attention to the plight of the thousands of Australian returned soldiers who as well as coping with the physical and emotional scars of wartime service were facing another battle - waging a grim, exhausting fight against the rigors of unemployment and adversity during the Great Depression of the early 1930s.

Two Minutes by CJ Dennis

The Armistice....A silence shrouds the city:
Men's heads are bowed and many an eye is wet,
As minds con o'er an olden tale of pity,
Of grief and terror no man may forget.
Then thro' the silence break old sounds - the cheering,
The marching feet, the clattering limber wheel;
And, thro' the tears, blurred pictures are appearing
Of leaf-brown soldiers and the glint of steel.

The Armistice....A sound comes now of weeping: New pictures form, and merge, and fade away In grim succession, thro' the dread years creeping Unto the dawning of this Glorious Day. "The Peace! The Victory!" Done is the grieving, As thro' the land speeds that exultant roar. Yet, thro' it all, a thread of pain goes weaving - Pain for the men who marched to march no more. The Armistice....Now bugles cease their wailing; The Silence ends, and life flows on, once more....

And this our tribute; what is it availing While living warriors still plead at our door? Warriors yet, grown old, but ever keeping The grim fight on, unarmed, unmailed, unled. Is all our debt to quit ghosts, long sleeping? Mourner, return. You would not mock the dead?

years ago. Jesus said:

Andrew McDonough has written a short children's book called Bob the Bird, which includes mention of a farmer who has sown his crop but is now, understandably, becoming anxious.

'What if it doesn't rain? What if the plants don't grow? What if I don't have enough food for my family?"

This is the present reality for so many of our farmers right now. When I talk with farming families, in fact with most locals, the conversation very quickly turns to the season we're having.

"It's the worst season in my living memory".
"I doubt I'll be getting the header out this year."

There are deep concerns about the financial impact, the flow on effect to local businesses and of course the risks to mental health for those who are already stretched with the rapidly rising cost of living.

In McDonough's story, Bob the Bird overhears the farmer's concerns. And he asks his friend, Kevin the Quail, whether the farmer has a Father in heaven who cares for him as much as He cares for the birds. Bob's question echoes Jesus' words to his own farming community 2000

"Look at the birds. They don't plant or harvest or store food in barns; for your heavenly Father feeds them. And aren't you more valuable to him than they are?"

The churches in this town and region continue to pray for rain. But no matter the outcome, we also hold Jesus' words as a personal message to each one of us: "You are valuable. You matter to me. You have a heavenly Father who cares for you."
