Hello Readers,

Welcome to the April 2025 edition of the Laura Standard. The dry spell is hanging on and it's been our hottest summer for 5 or 6 years but let's hope for a timely break to the season and a prosperous year for our district.

The Laura Fair returns again this year on April 5th and 6th. Let's hope we can have a repeat of the success of recent years where we have enjoyed fantastic weather and saw massive crowds. The LCDTA will again be running a Devonshire Tea stall, but for the first time in many years will not be situated between the Art Gallery and the Archives building. Along with many changes that you will notice this year this area will now be a dedicated children's area, and we will be utilizing the kitchen in the Civic Centre. This has been a fantastic fundraiser for many years and would not be possible without the support of the community, baking scones and volunteering on the weekend. Please join us in the Civic Centre for "Devonshire & More".

During the summer of 2023/24 the LCDTA was made aware that 8 of the 12 units in the North Parklands were not equipped with air conditioning after and an elderly resident collapsed in Meryles Café. We approached Housing SA about this but were unfortunately told that none of the current residents met the governments criteria for the supply of air conditioners. Local MP Geoff Brock was unable to get any further action on this but pledged to put some money toward the project and so, driven by LCDTA member Anthony Lines, quotes were sought as well as further funding by community groups such as the Laura Information Centre and Laura Bowls Club.

The LCDTA moved that we would cover any shortfall in funds and on March 4th Nettle Electrical installed 8 air conditioners for us. Many thanks to Koby and Daniel from Nettle Electrical for their work and to everyone involved in this project.

The Rocky River Community Shed held a morning tea and information session at the RSL on the 10th of February that was attended by about 30 interested locals. A big thank you to Frank Bernhardt, while not an a attendee, kindly offered the use of shed space the rear of the Laura Emporium to get this project off the ground. The Parafield Men's Shed has also donated a truck load of tools and equipment, and these were collected by Anthony Lines on the 26th of February, thanks again to Anthony for doing this. Although it is only early days both Karen Zwar (also an LCDTA member) and Anthony have done an amazing job pushing this project forward.

The Nature Playground group have been hard at work applying for funding and settling on a final design and there has also been some movement on the North Parklands project. The earthworks have been completed ready for the concrete pads, with thanks to Bradley Alm for doing this, and the old rose bushes have been removed in the Nita Klemm Gardens, with thanks to Marty Gilbert for his time and use of his forklift. Hopefully we can organise a couple of working bees in the near future to lay the concrete for the basketball half court and outdoor table tennis table, and to update the irrigation and replant the rose arbour.

Lastly, if you've driven in to town from the North, South or West in recent weeks you would have noticed the new "Welcome to Laura" signs. This project was driven by LCDTA secretary and Golden North's Rick Willis. Not only do they look fantastic but celebrate Golden North who have been a big part of our town for 102 years.

On behalf of the LCDTA I hope everyone enjoys The Fair and the Easter break and good luck to the Southern Flinders Football and Netball on the upcoming season.



Fire at Wilmington



On Monday, February 3, 2025, a lighting strike ignited a fire at Alligator Gorge, part of the Mount Remarkable National Park. In the first 24 hours, it burnt approx. 800ha (2000 acres) and continued to burn and expand over the next 3 weeks, burning nearly 5500ha in total.

Many CFS brigades from all over the state were called in to help assist DEW (Department of Environment and Water) and the 6 aircraft involved, including CFS members from Laura.

Of the 10 Laura members attending, 141 hours of volunteered time was spent at the fire actively fire fighting and monitoring the edges to prevent further spread of the fire, using the Laura 34 unit and particularly the Bundaleer QRV (Quick Response Vehicle) which is also housed at the Laura station. This does not take into account the hours of local farmers on their own private units that assisted at the fire as well, an important asset to our communities that are quite often the first on the scene at a crop/grass fire, and can often access places that the traditional CFS trucks cannot go.

Many thanks to these members that give up their time as a volunteer, not only to fight fires such as the Wilmington incident, but many other tasks such as helping retrieve patients onto stretchers to load into the ambulance, assisting with traffic diversions at road accidents and removing fallen trees across roads.

Defibrillator presented to Appila Church



An Automatic defibrillator was presented to members of the Holy Trinity Lutheran Church of Appila, by the Lions Club of Rocky River on the 26th of February 2025 at the Church. The AED was purchased by the club from funds raised from the grain samples tested at the silos, and then donated by the farmers for later sale by the Lions club. The Lions club raises money locally from various community events as well as the grain sales, but all the money from the grain sales is dedicated to be spent in the local community, whereas a proportion of money raised from other sources is used for disaster relief, medical research, training hearing dogs and other projects, both locally, interstate, and internationally.

The defibrillator was presented by club president Don Hucks to Church Committee chairperson, Merrelyn Zanker, who expressed her appreciation, and commented that although everyone hopes the AED will never be used, its presence may save a life in an area quite distant from a local ambulance base. The Lions club is very grateful for the generosity of the local farming community who allow us to profit from their grain samples, and to the staff at Viterra for their help in coordinating the process.

Economical Motoring Seventy Years Ago

Stevens Motors is the longest established business in Laura, and the Longest running Dodge/Chrysler/Mitsubishi dealership in Australia. The present day Stevens Motors is the continuation of the Dodge dealership which was secured by Hedley Stevens in the early 1930s. The Stevens era started in 1879 when James Stevens established an engineering and blacksmithing business near the North Laura Hotel.

Through the years the Chrysler/Dodge umbrella also included the Standard, Vanguard, Hillman, Triumph and Simca brands, but the strength of the enterprise stems from the Chrysler era which included Plymouths, Desotos, Chrysler Royals and Valiants along with the flagship Dodge Phoenixes.

Just seventy years ago in May 1955 the Waymouth Group of Companies conducted an economy run of Standard Cadet cars with selected dealerships across South Australia. The purpose of the run was to show the family man what could be done with a 10 horsepower car – the Standard Cadet, with a 948cc motor, was a rival to the Ford Prefect, Morris Minor and Austin A40 and later the VW Beetle.

At 10am on Tuesday 24th May 1955 a Standard Cadet car left Laura and thirteen other towns in SA simultaneously with the dealer and a prominent citizen as an observer; in this case the Rev Measday, the local Methodist minister. The goal was to drive with one gallon of petrol until it ran out, and then drive back with another gallon of petrol.

The local newspaper of the era, *The Northern Review* reported that, "Laura's car in the recent statewide economy trial really got a tough trial", according to the driver

Mr JL Stevens of Laura. "Despite the adverse weather and the bad roads, we averaged 46.75 miles per gallon" said Mr Stevens.

"It proved to me just what a 10 horsepower car can do. After my neutral observer, the Rev Jenner, had superintended the filling of two one gallon petrol tins, we started off in the teeth of a very strong north-easterly wind".

"We travelled to Stone Hut and Wirrabara, uphill to Murraytown and then over the hills and valleys to Booleroo Centre. We drove around the town to show the folks the Cadet and then drove along the road to Appila. The road from Appila to Jamestown contained hundreds of potholes and wash-aways.

At times I had to almost stop the car completely. Our first gallon of petrol gave up after climbing the steepest hill between Appila and Jamestown – 44 miles from Laura.

We started our second gallon with the wind blowing gale force and sleety rain making it cold enough for snow. We drove through the storm to Jamestown, then on to Caltowie and Gladstone. With the weather improving, we went on to Hughes Gap and on Crystal Brook road we turned back to Laura...reaching within 10 yards of the old Stone Hut Hotel. Our second gallon gave us 49 ½ miles...giving an average of 46.75 miles to the gallon".

Official Opening of the Laura Hospital Aged Care Upgrade

The opening of the Laura Hospital Aged Care Upgrade will take place on Friday, 2 May 2025, commencing at 3.00pm.

The Honourable Geoff Brock MP will officially open the new facility. Light refreshments will be available after the official ceremony. Community members are invited to attend.

A \$2.4M upgrade to the Laura & District Hospital's nursing home wing was recently completed. The upgrade included construction of three new resident rooms, complete with private ensuites. The upgrade also incorporated new ensuites retrofitted within the existing building, providing each resident with a private bathroom, eliminating shared facilities. The upgrade eliminates the need for shared rooms and has meant the return of one acute bed to the hospital's acute services. Other improvements include new flooring, joinery and a fresh coat of paint.

The State Government contributed \$850,000 towards the upgrade, while \$600,000 came from the Federal Government via the Multi-Purpose Services Minor Capital Grant Program. The Southern Flinders Health Advisory Council invested \$970,000, made possible due to a generous bequest from the late Ada Hincks. The Northern Areas Council gifted a small piece of land to support the redevelopment.

EASTER



We country folk are a fairly caring bunch on the whole. If there's any kind of disaster, the entire community pitches in to support and care for each other. This is especially evident during bushfires.

In 2014 I was privileged to serve as a disaster chaplain during the Southern Flinders fires. As a result, I went into Wirrabara forest with the government damages assessment team to talk to people who had been impacted by it. Even though it was only a couple of days after the first fire had gone through, I was amazed to see new growth: green shoots sprouting from burnt out stumps, pink lilies appearing out of blackened ground, and spiders going about their business of restoring their webs in the crevices of burnt bark.

It seemed as if I was witnessing a sort of resurrection I would never have thought possible.

As I talked to people on farms and orchards, their resilience impressed me, but I was aware of the fact that this was only the beginning of their journey through grief and loss and trauma, and that they would need friends along the way who they could rely on to listen, love and encourage them.

I don't know whether I was much help at the time, After all, I hadn't experienced their trauma or loss. But I do know someone who has, and is willing to be there 24/7 for them, or for anyone who is hurting and in grief.

This is the one who *has* been there, done that, and bought the T shirt, so he's far better qualified than me to know what it feels like. He is the one who holds out his scarred hands and says, "Come, Let me walk with you. Let me love you into new life."

Here is resurrection, seen not just in the sign of green growth after bushfires, but in the healing of our broken hearts as we journey with him.

May you find this resurrection promise and healing joy as you celebrate Easter.
